Re: Ballots for the September Primary – please take action immediately.

If your town has had a big increase in registered voters since Town Meeting, please email mjacobs@sec.state.vt.us or fax to (802) 828-5171 before June 25th what you believe will be your total number of registered voters for the September 14th Primary.

- We will print 50% of your 2004 Town Meeting checklist for Primary Ballots as required by law unless you give us different information.
- For voting machine towns, 40% of your ballots will be scored for use as absentee ballots.

Each voting machine town is responsible for arranging and paying for programming needed for your voting machines for the Primary and General Election.

NOT LATER THAN JUNE 25TH: Towns that are divided into more than one State Representative District or that use more than one polling place must fax your best estimate of the number of registered voters in each District in your town to (802) 828-5171 or email to mjacobs@sec.state.vt.us. We cannot send you the right number of ballots for each district unless we receive the Legislative District checklist breakdowns from you.

If your BCA has changed any of your polling locations, please notify us by June 25th. We will need this updated information to post on our website and to print on your Official Return of Votes forms.
